### Care Inspection Report

We were recently the subject of an unannounced inspection by the Care Inspectorate, the official body which monitors quality of provision in the Daycare of Children sector. We are delighted to announce that we received ratings of Very Good (5) across the board. We were told this was an "outstanding" achievement and one which we are not only delighted but very proud. In discussion with officers from the local authority and the Care Inspectorate we have learned that there is only one service in the whole of the country which has been rated higher since the onset of COVID.

### Woodland Play Sessions



We are continuing to spend as much time in the woods as we can and we can see children's confidence and stamina and general physical skills increasing through these sessions. We have particularly enjoyed the new woodland furniture currently located in our woodland site. We have harvested most of the vegetables grown in our plot in the Walled Garden and, over the next few weeks, we will be clearing the plots and preparing them for winter.

With the change in season the woods have become significantly more muddy as I'm sure you are aware. In

order for children to be able to

explore the full potential of the woods as an enjoyable play learning environment it is important that they have the right clothing for the conditions. While we have waterproof puddle suits it is also important for children to have plenty of warm layers on underneath. Please make sure children always have spare clothing available (and more than one set would be preferable). We would also ask that nursery clothing is returned to us as we are running short of emergency changes.
